The Bible and the Church Fathers

The Bible and the Virgin Mary

Following the interpretive pattern of the authors of Scripture and the Fathers of the Church,

The Bible and the Virgin Mary examines the role of Mary in salvation history.

Through typology we study her role as the New Eve, the Ark of the Covenant, and the Queen Mother.

This study also examines Catholic doctrine with regard to the Blessed Virgin, answering common objections along the way.
